Y6 ART TRIP TO PHGS

As part of Y6's transition programme the class were invited to spend a morning in the Art Department at PHGS last week.

They thoroughly enjoyed exploring their creativity with the support of the art teachers and a wide range of materials, tools and techniques.

The children decided they would like to create a collective montage of letters to spell out Whartons and in the process considered subtle artistic techniques to add depth and definition to their letters.

We were fortunate this term to have two sets of student visitors from PHGS who came to work with our children across school. For their own development, students from Y10 and Y12 spend a few sessions working in classes to support children's learning.

Firstly, ten Y10 students engaged with classes from across school for an afternoon supporting children's learning in a range of different areas. The students had been given a choice of year groups and learning situations. They matched their skills to the learning activities Wharton's children were carrying out. There were students supporting in art sessions, some supported children in their French and others with reading and writing. We are very grateful to the students for giving up their time to support our younger children. We were also lucky enough to have a visit from a group of sixth form Geography

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Health Week and the 'Screen Free' Challenge

As part of this we will be taking part in lots of 'MindMate' sessions aimed at promoting positive mental health as well as getting physical throughout the week. Children will come off their normal timetable for this week to take part in some exciting sessions such as some heathy food workshops and to participate in Sports Day on Friday.

We will also be setting a whole school challenge which will come home with your child on Friday 29th June. The challenge is for your child, and the whole family as much as possible, to be 'screen free' for a week and thus to come up with some new activities that could be done instead in their free time. We will then share children's progress at the end of health week and award some prizes for the most creative and successful participants!

Middle Leaders Collaboration

We are very fortunate to work so closely with our cluster of primary schools across Otley, Pool and Bramhope; sharing good practice and learning from each other.

Over the last term some of the middle leaders from across all our schools have been working together on a project to improve their leadership skills and positively impact on raising the standards of teaching and learning in their individual subject areas.

The teachers involved have engaged in coaching partnerships, joint action planning and reciprocal visits to partner schools. Each leader had their own focus, in the case of the Whartons Mrs Dowell has been improving computing across school, Mrs Manderville has developed sketchbooks to raise standards in art and Miss Stewart has introduced a new structured approach to teaching DT consistently across all classes.

To celebrate the end of the project Headteachers and Governors from each school were invited to a presentation afternoon where the leaders shared their projects, successes, impacts and next steps.

The collaboration was so successful we will be extending it to other teachers in future years. Well done to all the staff involved, including Mr Hampson who worked with other senior leaders and our school improvement adviser Trish Lowson to facilitate the project.
