Dear Parents and Carers,

As we end another half term it has been lovely to feel that spring has arrived finally. Y5 completed a blindfold darkness trail around the wildlife area, having to trust their classmates and follow other senses. #### <u>Y6 Fitness Videos</u>

This week Year 6 have taken on the role of Joe Wicks and have delivered some incredible exercise sessions to different year group across school.

They have been working on their routines in groups within their PE sessions this term and each group had to work as a team to create a fun and engaging warm up, main exercise and cool down, incorporating cardiovascular, balance and strength exercises to target all parts of our body and to get the whole school both physically and mentally healthy. Well done to all children who participated and to all of our Year 6 children who showed great confidence and skill in delivering their sessions.

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#### **Year 1 Outdoor Maths**

The Year 1 children donned their wellies, grabbed their clipboards and measuring equipment earlier this week, to take their maths measuring lesson up to the wildlife area.

Setting the learning in a real and practical context supported the children's understanding of concepts whilst challenging

them to problem solve and work collaboratively. Obviously, all great fun too.



#### Handball Tournament

Year 2 children have been learning how to play handball with Ms Jones from PHGS, and Mr Williamson, in their PE lessons over the last half term.

Last week the class walked down to PHGS to take part in an interschool Handball competition.

The event as always was so well organized by the staff and Y10 students at Prince Henry's. Our year 2 children played several games against other family of schools Y2 teams. In

between each game they rotated around skills activities on the tennis courts. It was very exciting for the children, a real experience. We are so pleased that PHGS provide this opportunity for collaboration



and we feel it is a great use of the sports funding grant.

#### Stargazing Sleepover

Last Friday the Year 5 children spent an exciting evening in school. Mr Fisk had planned a whole range of interactive activities linked to their science topics on light and electricity.

Firstly we all joined together in a darkened hall making human electric circuits to activate light and sound devices. It was fascinating for the children to discover that electricity can travel through our bodies, conducting the electricity from person to person, fingertip to fingertip.

When it became dark, we went out onto the playground to play a torch tig game, hiding behind obstacles to avoid being seen by the touch bearers beams of light. Then, when the clouds finally parted, we stood in the middle of the field; used maps of the constellations to identify the stars.

Mr Fisk and Mr Hampson had constructed a rope trail around the wildlife area where children wore blindfolds and had to rely on each other and their senses to navigate the obstacles.

Towards the end of the evening Mr Fisk lite a bonfire and the children toasted marshmallows. Then it was time to retire back inside, change into cosy nightwear and watch short films whilst munching on popcorn. The whole event was fantastic, the children were brilliantly behaved and really enjoyed each other's company in their dorm rooms.
