

Last week Mrs Manderville, Miss Dalzell, Mrs Rockcliff and Miss Wilkinson visited the children at home. It is always great for the EYFS staff to meet the children in their own, familiar surroundings. It often helps the children with their confidence to talk to their new teachers

A Final Note:

I have been talking to the children about accessories for school this week in assemblies and explaining the thinking behind none branded products and clothing in school; for example water bottles (AIR-UPs) and premium branded hoodies.
