Our topic for this half term is 'What is in Beatrix Potter's garden?'. There will be a focus on plants and trees and we will be doing lots of gardening work and spending time outside in our amazing outdoor surroundings. We will also be looking at the animals in Beatrix Potter's stories and will be learning all about the lady herself; her early life, what inspired her to write and her love of the countryside.

We have transformed our role play area into a garden centre where the children can choose different items and practise using the correct money to buy them.

Science	Our focus this term is trees and plants. The children will start the topic by exploring the parts of a plant/tree and the importance of each part. We will also identify UK trees and wild and garden flowers within the school grounds. At the end of the topic the children will plant their own sunflower and take these home to look after.	Ask your child to name different flowers you see in your own garden and outdoors. Which were planted there and which are growing wild? Talk about the importance of each part of a plant and what we need to do to look after them.
History	We will learn about the life of a significant individual from the past – Beatrix Potter. We will look at key dates and order them on our topic board. We will observe and handle artefacts from the Victorian era and we will discover facts about key moments in her life such and discover what inspired her to write and illustrate her famous children's books.	Can they order dates chronologically? It could be ordering what they did that day, morning or week. Ask your child what they have learnt already about Beatrix Potter. Where did she live as a child? Did she have brothers or sisters? Why was her schooling unusual? When did she start writing? Why did she fall in love with the Lake District?
Art	In Art, we will learn all about mixing primary colours to create secondary colours. Moving on from the work we did last half-term with thick brushes, the children will use thinner paintbrushes and develop their brush strokes and control. The children will make colour wheel collages from materials which have been cut, torn or glued.	Can your child remember the primary colours? Do they know which primary colours are mixed to make secondary colours?
