

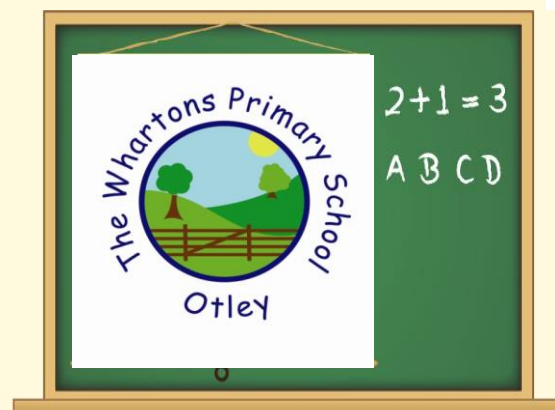
# The Whartons Fortnightly Newsletter

### *World Book Day*

In celebration of World Book Day on 2<sup>nd</sup> March, Mr Fisk, our English leader, is organising a special theme day on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> March

Personally I enjoy to be really cosy and relaxed when I embark on a reading session, and as a result I will be wearing a pair of PJs. I can't wait to see the array of book characters or reading related costumes on show. Let's celebrate a real love of reading!

As we continue our journey of improvement and build on the good practice which is abundant within school we requested, and engaged in a follow up Teaching and Learning Review two weeks ago.

At the end of the summer term representatives from the local authority, led by Peter Marsh, who is also an experienced Ofsted Inspector, carried out a review of progress towards our Ofsted targets. The review went extremely well and I shared the report with you, also publishing the outcomes on the website. In order to continue our good work and embed the improvements there were some recommendations from the review for us to work on.

On 8th of February I received a phone call from Peter giving notice that a follow up review would be taking place the next day. Some of you may have seen and spoken to one of the team on the playground. The review was carried out following an Ofsted style format where advisors observed lessons, scrutinized books, analysed pupil data and strategic plans and not least talked in depth with the children. I am pleased to say the review went very well and the report praises the further improvements made, calling this 'impressive'. I want to thank everyone for their support and hard work, especially the children. You can read the report on the website

## **UK Day**

On Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> February, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 enjoyed an exciting UK Day. This was a full day dedicated to focusing on Geography skills; learning about the four UK countries and their capital cities. The children split into four mixed age groups and went off to 'visit' the four countries and learn about them in exciting, creative ways.

Each child was given a UK passport to take on their journey. Once there, they used maps to locate the country and capital city, discovered interesting facts and took part in a focused activity. In England, they wrote a postcard from an imagined visit to London; in Scotland they baked Scottish flapjack; in Wales, they created daffodil, dragon or castle art work and in Northern Ireland they learnt an Irish jig!

The children (and staff) came to school wearing clothes or colours associated with the UK and everyone had a fantastic day where they learnt lots. Thank you to all the staff who worked so hard to organise and deliver such an exciting day.
