### Reception Phonics Open Morning

It was lovely to welcome reception parents into school this week to participate in a phonics open morning.

The children thoroughly enjoyed demonstrating how they learnt and practiced reading and recognizing new sounds, through activities in the provision areas around the classroom.

As a school we adopted a new phonics scheme at the end of last year called 'Bug Club'. The scheme uses interactive visuals and sounds

to support the teaching of new graphemes and phonemes. Then the children explore and consolidate new learning through play

### Armistice Day

It was very moving to see all the children gathered together on the playground on Friday last week for Armistice Day.

Each of the children held one of our painted Poppy Pebbles during the minute's silence to remember.

Mr Fisk led the remembrance one minute silence, explaining to the children about remembering all those who give so much for the benefit of others. The children joined in respectfully with the one

minute of quiet reflection, then placed their Poppies on the wall next to the display areas where they will be secured permanently.

### Science Club

I had a great time on Tuesday after school with the children at our new science club.

I chatted to the children about the different aspects of science – Biology, Physics and Chemistry, and explained that each area was the study of a different aspect of the world around them.

We will be focusing on Biology through studying plants this half term. For the first science club session we planted seeds in different conditions and will be observing them over the next 4 or 5 weeks to see how well they flourish, or not.

Next week will be venturing out into the wildlife area to study the trees there. We will be using field guides, leaves and bark patterns to identify each species.

In the weeks to come we will explore hydroponics, dissect flowers and investigate the mechanics of spinning and exploding seeds.



#### Cultural Experiences Visitor

Ms Matthews who is our Religious Education leader booked a special visitor for the children across school last week.

Ms Winburn visited class across KS1 and KS2 to talk to the children about being Jewish and some customs. The children learn about different religions through a range of topics in RE so they can better understand the differences and similarities between different people.

Ms Winburn made special bread called challah with the children and the children in Y4 remembered and explained to me that the bread is plaited so there are no sharp corners. The children also learned about Shabbat as a day of rest with no technology or homework, and a day perhaps to reflect on key issues in life. Our visitor commented on



how well the children listened and engaged during the sessions and how much they already knew and could share. I would like to thank Ms Winburn for sharing her knowledge with the children and showing them how to make Challah bread. Everyone had a fascinating time.

We have begun the preparations for Christmas performances, and I am sure your children will be bringing home words and songs to practice. I apologise in advance for bringing Christmas in November, but we would appreciate all your help in learning words. Have a lovely weekend.
