
The Whartons' Newsletter

Y6 working together to create balanced arguments

Year 6 have been developing their writing skills this week through studying how to construct a balanced argument.

The children worked collaboratively to consider the pros and cons of the focus subject area of zoos. There were many different considerations and apposing views. Discussion was rich and Mrs Gomes helped the children to back up their thoughts and ideas with reasoning and evidence.

Y6 then examined good examples of reasoned arguments and dismantled then in order to ascertain what made each example a well-constructed piece of persuasive writing. The children then worked on

features which would eloquently convey their points of view.

The ability to write a supported balanced argument is a skill which will support children in their learning across the curriculum as they move on to secondary school. Well done Y6 you really showed a mature approach to this task.

Singing, performing and recording in Y3

Year 3 had the very exciting opportunity to take part in a singing and performance event this week.

One of our parents, Mr Wainwright works in the creative industries and as part of his work he has written and designed a new video and story project installation which has been created for North of the Tyne, Under the Stars. This is a free outdoor festival of projection, magic and storytelling, inspired by local stories and landscapes

from across Newcastle, Northumberland and North Tyneside. The story is about the journey of children and animals. To add atmosphere, direction and meaning to the story Mr Wainwright needed a choir of children to sing the backdrop.

Of course, he knew just where to come. The children in Y3 have practiced the audio and Mr Hamilton came into school this week to support the children in their performance

and to record their pieces. It was very exciting, and I am sure it will greatly enhance the experience for visitors to the installation in the North East over the half term holidays.
