
# 7<sup>th</sup> June 2019

## Maths Calculation Evening

Thank you to Mr Hampson for hosting a Maths Calculation Evening for parents just before half term.

Mr Hampson shared our school's calculation policy, explaining the different methods we teach children at school to solve mathematical problems using the four calculation operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Each operation has clear stages and steps to build children's knowledge and understanding over their time in school. For each new stage it was demonstrated to the parents how methods are taught firstly through the use of practical apparatus, then supported through the use of pictorial models and finally abstract written methods.

Problem solving can be very tricky in maths and children need to be taught the skills, and different logical approaches, to work out the answers to their challenges. We use a scheme called STOPS Problem solving to support children's collaborative group work. I hope the evening was helpful and I know Mr Hampson is planning another evening to look specifically at division!

## Otley Show Entries

This week it was my pleasure to congratulate children in the assembly for their amazing entries to the Otley Show this year. Thanks to Mrs Dowell who organized the entries and shipping of the artwork down to the showground.

Three classes used their Art and English lessons to create their entries. Year 5 produced amazing wands from twigs found in the wildlife area and decorated them with a range of materials to make them individual. Reception children used a wide variety of pasta shapes to fashion pasta pictures and Year 4 children all used beautiful penmanship when writing poems

for their entries in the handwriting class.

All the entries were displayed proudly at the show and many children received  $1^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  place certificates and cash prizes, as well as many more receiving highly commended comments from judges.

All the children worked extremely hard to produce their best work and should be proud of their efforts. Mrs Manderville has also organised for other classes to create
