
The Whartons Fortnightly Newsletter

Year 5- Readers in to writers

In English we have been reading a book called 'Sky Hawk' written by Gill Lewis.

We have really enjoyed reading this book and are currently at chapter ten. Firstly, we summarized chapters one and two in our own words, then we created a table of each of the characters' key personality features, through using evidence from the text. This is one of the learning objectives we have been working on in Year 5, which is to identify the techniques authors' use to create characters and enhance the reader's understanding of those characters.

Next, we put ourselves in the main character Callum's, shoes and wrote about his thoughts, feelings and fears when he upset Lona.

Reading Sky Hawk has helped us with writing our own setting descriptions. We went out into the wildlife area and school grounds and took photographs of nature. We used these photographs, and some of the techniques used by Gill Lewis, to write setting descriptions. Writing down what we could hear, see and feel helped with us describe the context of the setting.
