

Home Learning - Stories set in imaginary worlds

Please find a list of activities related to our new topic stories set in imaginary worlds. For your homework, you need to achieve a minimum total of 10 points by the end of this half term (please feel free to do more than 10!). I would like you to complete at least one activity from each subject so that you are exploring and developing different skills.

To ensure that I can monitor your progress please bring in your homework learning log book every Monday. Your book should show your completed activities and any that you are currently working on.

As English is a main focus, it is beneficial that most activities have this focus, for example if you do a baking activity - you could photograph the different stages of what you do and your child could write instructions for a 'How to make ...' guide. **Also in addition a Maths based activity is always advisable, 5 minutes working on your times tables, mental maths etc every day will benefit greatly.** If you need any further clarification or guidance then please don't hesitate to come in and ask.

The sheets that are required to complete some tasks are available in class when needed.

Subject/ Area of study	1 Point	2 Points	3 Points
Maths (focus on times tables)	Show me how you are working on your times tables. Practise counting in different steps and writing out your times tables.	Compose your own rap for the six or seven times table or if you would rather draw, design a jazzy poster to help you learn your current times tables.	Draw a map of an imaginary world inside a grid consisting of letter/number coordinates. Can you label where different elements of your imaginary world are using grid references? e.g. Waterfall of Memories (A,3) or Never-ending Hole (D,6)
Literacy	Use your parents to help, or the school librarian or the internet. How many children's books can you identify that include an imaginary world? Can you create a list of up to ten books? How many of them can you read this term? What was your favourite and why?	Write a diary extract as if you have recently visited the Snow Queens Palace.	Write a tourist leaflet about a fantasy land. It could be the Chocolate Factory, Narnia or even outer space.
Art	Design and draw a 'gateway' to an imaginary world. Can you physically open it? What do you see when you look inside? Will your gateway be a simple every day object or an ornate gateway of wonder?	Create a map of an imaginary world with a key of different places. Eg, the forest of the talking trees, field of smiling smartie flowers.	Explain you art in your homework book.
Design and Make			Make an imaginary world of your choice using a small box e.g. shoe box and write a short description explaining what you can see and hear there. OR Design and make an imaginary creature from an imaginary land.
Music			Compose a song using a music app (for example - Garage band) or live on an instrument (for example - ukulele) about an Imaginary World. Perform the song to the class either live or from a recording.
