On Tuesday 22nd November, Year 5 and Year 6 took part in a dynamic workshop which explored the concepts of peace, conflict, extremism, resilience, choices and consequences, during both WWI and here and now in the 21st century. Using a range of first hand sources and focusing on a range of individuals forced to make very different and very difficult decisions, the workshop asked us to consider what we would do in extreme situations. Children were involved in a range of activities which encouraged them to question prejudice, propaganda, and pre-conceptions, giving them tools to build personal resilience to modern day propaganda and prejudice and encourage them to welcome and support community cohesion.

'Choices Then & Now' has been identified as a model of Best Practice by the Prevent team at the Home Office and the Department for Education & is now being rolled out across the UK. Orienteering

Two weeks ago Mr Hampson's class enjoyed learning the art of orienteering in preparation for the whole school outdoor learning week last week. They honed their skills in direction finding, sequencing, map reading and navigation using compass points; all under a time pressure. They worked collaboratively and used their reasoning and deeper thinking skills to complete their tasks.

Last week the year 6 children transferred their skills and supported younger children in completing orienteering courses around the school grounds as part of outdoor week.
