

Drop Off and Pick Up

Big Write Half Termly Whole School Focus

Children thoroughly enjoy their fortnightly Big Write session where they have the opportunity to build their stamina and write at length about something they have talked about at school.

In order to further enhance the Big Write sessions we have decided to introduce a half termly whole school input where all the school experience a stimulus or 'wow' moment. These stimuli will create discussion and enthusiasm and then all the children will engage in writing in the same style or genre. This approach will create a purpose and audience for the children's writing and develop their skills in writing in different genres.

Our first stimulus was led by Mr Fisk who introduced the children to a crime scene 'Who ate all the chocolate?!' Staff were interviewed and culprits questioned. The children then went back to classes to investigate an age appropriate crime scenario of their own and all the children wrote newspaper articles. What a great whole school focus to raise the profile of writing for a purpose. I can't wait to find out what will stimulate writing next.

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Phonics Morning

Mrs Matthews hosted a phonics open morning for Reception parents earlier in the term. Parents were invited to spend the morning in class observing how the children learn their phonics and use their knowledge through their activities in the provision areas.

The children thoroughly enjoyed showing parents how they learn and play and I hope that observing strategies used by staff will help parents to support their children's learning at home through the practice and application of their skills.





Houses Relaunch

Following a re-launch assembly led by Mrs Foley the staff have been working together with their house groups to raise the profile of the houses point system and build real team spirit and a collaborative approach to house groups.

The children worked together during House assembly time to invent a house identity.

The first step has been to choreograph a house celebration dance which houses can perform in front of a whole school assembly on Friday if their house collects the most house points for the week. Each week all children can win house tokens for their behaviour, effort, kindness etc. These are added to the house 'pot' and counted up on a Thursday by the team captains. The house that collects the most points each week is celebrated in assembly on Friday. Each week the pots are emptied and every house starts from zero the next week. Houses are a great way for children to work together and gain a sense of pride in a whole team effort.

In the future Mrs Foley would like houses to design their own crests or logos and maybe a plaque for the hall.

Deadly Visitors in Y2!

As part of our Year 2 theme of 'Deadly Animals', we arranged for the *Reptile Rangers* to come and see us with some of their exotic animals. All the children had the chance to handle or look at some of these 'deadly' animals: a boa constrictor, a blue-tongued skink, a tarantula, a giant African millipede, a Madagascan hissing cockroach, a hog-nosed viper, red clawed scorpion and bearded dragon. Every one of the children was really brave — even those who felt a little worried at the start had a go and handled the animals. Hopefully, all the parents have received photos of their children with the animals via email from the Year 2 team.

"I enjoyed when the animals came in and we sketched using shading. I sketched a lion's head. When the Reptile Rangers came in, I liked holding the big snake because it felt so soft and squidgy. When they got the bearded dragon out it felt bumpy and spikey."
