Y4 Ukulele's

Last week Y4 were introduced to their class instrument for the year- The Ukulele.

As part of the school's musical instrument teaching progression, Y4 will be learning how to play the ukulele this year. Mr Young has been taking master classes from Mr Williamson in preparation, and although a little nervous, he is keen to start the learning journey with the children. Mr Young has already acquired a new skill, tuning a ukulele. He had plenty of practice this week when, armed with an app, he managed to tune almost 40 instruments in one day!!

The children will be learning how to read simple music, master key chords and play together as an ensemble. These skills will be built upon through school.

Mr Williamson, our music leader, has also ordered Ocarinas and keyboards to add to the children's comprehensive instrument programme through school. From this year Y2 will be learning how to play an Orcerina, Y3 recorders, Y4 Ukuleles and Y5 keyboards

Huge thanks to the Parents Association for funding the new instruments and Mr Williamson for developing this new approach to all children acquiring playing skills.

Enterprise WOW Day

Mrs Matthews and Mrs Manderville were the teachers in charge of planning the Spring Term WOW day. They decided that it would be a great experience for the whole school to work together using their enterprise and creative skills to raise some money for their classes.

Enterprise is one of our curriculum drivers which we endeavor to weave through the children's learning. The

teachers have been planning their Enterprise foci with the children for the last week or two and all the ideas have been very much driven by the children's interests. Engaging in an enterprise project ensures a guiding purpose for the children's learning. The children have costed their projects and calculated profits; they have used artistic skills to make eye catching posters which advertise their wares; they have used design and technology skills to produce video adverts, sharing these with other classes, and finally used a whole raft of creative applications on products from fruit kebabs to muffins and rainbow crayons to photo booths. together to make the day a huge success and to parents for financially supporting the project by purchasing the children's products and services.
