There are many areas of the 'Remote Education Support' within the DfE guidance. We are committed to:

- planning a programme that is of <u>equivalent length</u> and <u>quality</u>, to the core teaching pupils would receive in school, ideally including daily contact with teachers/teacher led sessions/
- using high-quality online/offline resources
- using online tools consistently, across all classes
- providing printed resources/textbooks/workbooks for pupils without online access
- providing all pupils with an exercise book in which to complete some of their work
- providing meaningful and ambitious daily work, within a number of different subjects
- providing clear explanations delivered by a teacher or through a high-quality video/resource
- providing high-quality verbal or written feedback (via the online platform)
- adjusting pace or difficulty in response to questions and ongoing assessment
- avoiding an overreliance on long-term projects or internet research activities

When will we provide remote learning?

Remote learning will be provided: 'where a class, group or small number of pupils need to self-isolate, or there is a local lockdown requiring children to stay at home' (DfE)

When will we not provide remote learning?

When individuals are ill, either with Covd-19 or any other unrelated illness

What if a staff member is ill?

Another member of staff will ensure remote learning is still provided to the class whose teacher is ill

What if a family or staff member has internet issues?

- In this instance, class teachers will contact families by phone once a week
- Another staff member would ensure remote learning is provided

How will we ensure online safety?

- Staff complete statutory online safety training
- E-safety lessons are provided for all pupils
- Parents receive guidance for the online 'platform'
